


Miscellaneous News and Notes

Cool has been discovered in the mountains of Colorado.

A Turnover has been organized at Chicago.

More than 4,000,000 of German mail in the United States.

A "Law German" Club has been organized at Carroll, Ia.

The first of Scandinavian immigrants arrived at Chicago.

The first quail will enter manufacturing in Nevada was started at White Pine in 1910.

The Turnout of New Orleans has been a Turnor Hall costing about \$100,000. It is one of the finest in this country.

Most of the German immigrants who have recently arrived in this country are farmers.

They have settled in the West.

The Germans of Central City, Colorado, have erected a Turnor Hall, and established a German-American Private School.

The closing of the tobacco factories at Greenville, S. C., has alleged revenue tax on the growing about 600 percent and would have destroyed the industry.

The imports of wheat into Great Britain this year have averaged 30 percent less than in 1910.

The Faculty of Arts College make up the class divisions now on a basis of corresponding numbers.

Joseph Newman has established a silk factory in San Francisco, with a reeling machine of his own invention. He is now making some very fine silk for sale.

At Memphis, on Tuesday last, two negroes named Farmer and Bateman, fought each other with knives. The former received fatal wounds, and the latter had his hands and arms nearly severed about the knuckles.

An old pioneer and prominent lawyer of San Francisco, named Col. Geo. F. Senn, died suddenly on Monday night.

The ceremony of decorating the graves of Union soldiers at Memphis was attended by five or six thousand persons.

A box containing nine men was carried off by a mob in the funeral boat Rumford last Tuesday, and three drowned.

Among the passengers by the steamer Kentucky, from New York to Liverpool, yesterday, was Mrs. Frances Ann Kemble.

A St. Louis jury has awarded to James Smith \$10,000 damages for cruel treatment.
